





CHALLENGES IDENTIFIED DURING PHASE I

High turnover of national focal points to consistently provide quality data

CHALLENGES PHASE I

Weak coordination structures at national level to facilitate data collection;

High levels of bandwidth consumption by the system hence causing accessibility challenges by most countries. Low capacity by countries to collect quality data and reporting in a timely manner;

Inexistence of baseline value for indicators

Roles and functions of the National Coordination Platform

Ensure coordination of data collection, quality checks and reporting of WASSMO indicators; Prepare and submit the minutes of NCP meetings and capacity development activities, through the focal point ministry with a brief to AMCOW secretariat

Organize and facilitate of monitoring and reporting coordination meetings at country level; Organize and facilitate national validation meetings at country level on WASSMO indicators data

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
